	the field of CLIL with colleagues from different European countries.
Course structure and	This is an interactive and experiential training course with a focus on CLIL
content	methodologies. The course consists of face-to-face instruction delivered through
	a combination of lectures, practical exercises, and workshops. The course will
	provide participants with a step-by-step guide for improving their own teaching
	and integrating CLIL into their lesson plan. Specifically, participants will have
	hands-on experience in designing their own material based on CLIL principles,
	developing a common set of strategies for implementing CLIL in the classroom,
	assessing their own lesson plans using authentic materials, and engaging in peer-
	to-peer mentoring. Course topics will cover a general introduction to CLIL and its basic principles, effective lesson planning using CLIL methodology, the integration
	of culture into CLIL, authentic materials for CLIL lessons and performance
