EU policies and the Digital Education




- The European Skills Agenda, of 1 July 2020, supports digital skills for all for sustainable competitiveness, social fairness and resilience
- The Digital Education Action Plan 2021 2027 with objectives of:
 - i) enhancing digital skills and competences for the digital transformation
 - ii) fostering the development of a high-performing digital education system.
- The Digital Compass and the European Pillar of Social Rights Action Plan set the ambitious policy targets of reaching a minimum of 80% of the population with basic digital skills and having 20 million ICT specialists by 2030

Importance of the Digital Competence of Educators in Europe

The Digital Education Action Plan has one of its objectives related specificly to the teacher, trainer digital competences.

These competences are supported by the **DigCompEdu** and its tools, but also by diverse online tools, platforms that provide learning opportunities online and make digital collaboration, sharing real.

European School Education Platform - ESEP

- Previously, School Education Gateway and eTwinning
- Launched in 2022, the European School Education Platform is the meeting point for all stakeholders in the school education sector:
 - o school staff,
 - o researchers,
 - o policymakers,
 - and other professionals

It includs all levels from early childhood education and care to primary and secondary school, including initial vocational education and training.

European School Education Platform

- Stay informed with new content published every week, including opinion pieces by experts, news articles, interviews, current news, and examples of practices.
- Find resources such as reports from recent research, teaching materials created in European projects and training courses, and the European Toolkit for Schools with material on preventing early school leaving and a self-assessment tool to help you develop your own school activities.
- **Get familiar with funding** through the Erasmus+ opportunities, consisting of three practical tools (course catalogue, mobility opportunities directory, and strategic partnership search) to help schools prepare their Erasmus+ applications.
- **Develop yourself** with the professional development opportunities such as free online courses, webinars, and teaching materials in collaboration with the EU Academy.
- Interact, collaborate, and develop projects with other verified school staff in Europe in the eTwinning community.

eTwinning



Launched in 2005, eTwinning is a community of educators and other school staff in initial vocational education and training and education from early childhood education and care to upper secondary schools from countries participating in eTwinning.

eTwinning promotes school collaboration in Europe through the use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT)

What does the eTwinning platform offer?



eTwinners can network, share, and collaborate by connecting through the social networking features offered, and by engaging in:

- Rooms micro-groups that allow eTwinners to take part in videoconferencing sessions supported by a forum and a file archive.
- eTwinning groups virtual places where eTwinners meet and discuss specific subjects, topics, or other areas of interest. Featured Groups are groups coordinated by the CSS and moderated by experienced eTwinners).
- eTwinning projects include activities on different topics and key competences involving two or more teachers and their students. Each project has its own TwinSpace, a free-to-use, safe platform that is only accessible to other eTwinning members in the project, your selected guests, and your selected pupils.

What does the eTwinning platform offer?



eTwinners can also join the **online professional development** opportunities organised by the European School Education Platform, available exclusively to them:

- Short online courses intense and enjoyable and introduce teachers to a topic, stimulate ideas, and help them develop their skills.
- MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) 4-6 weeks in length and require 12

 25 hours of learning time during this period. Participants are free to conduct the activities at a time of their convenience during the duration of the course. A certificate is offered upon successful completion.
- Webinars live one-hour long online video sessions where teachers have the chance to learn about and discuss a variety of themes.
- Webinar series two webinar sessions that are connected by an interactive online activity.
- Online conferences and events designed for and dedicated to specific target audiences and themes.

eTwinning - Five Principle Benefits



- Connectivity: The eTwinning database means it's easy to connect and build relationships with schools across Europe
- **Development:** You and your students can develop digital literacy and ICT skills in a secure environment.
- **Support:** Kits and resources are available to help you run your projects; access to funded eTwinning professional development workshops and seminars around Europe and online
- Intercultural Exchange: Students can learn about European cultures and languages by directly linking with their peers
- **Recognition:** There is recognition for your projects and school through eTwinning Awards (the National Quality Label, eTwinning Schools Label, European Quality Label, Annual eTwinning Prize.)




How to join?

- and request to be validated as an eTwinner by the National Support Organisation in the country where your school is.
