



GETTING IN AMSTERDAM

By car

The best way to reach Amsterdam by car is to use the A10 highway that surrounds the city centre. Please note that, while Amsterdam is quite well connected to the rest of Europe, the inner city is not very car friendly, getting informed beforehand on where to park your car and using public transport is a good idea.

By train

Amsterdam Centraal is the city's main train station and it's located right at the center of the city. From there you can either walk or take the several options of public transport. For the public transportation, you can use the official <u>webpage</u>. Taxis are also available, you can either go directly outside of the train station and call one of the taxis parked there or you can call +31 6 85672263.

By plane



Amsterdam Schiphol, is the main airport of the city. From this airport you can reach the centre in the following ways:

- **by taxi**: you can find a taxi in the Schiphol Plaza, right outside the airport. More information on the fees are available here.
- by train: it connects the airport

with the central station of Amsterdam, you can find more information on how to get your tickets and find the timetables <u>here</u>. The journey takes between 15 and 25 minutes.



• **by bus:** the bus line 397 connects the city to the airport, to plan your ride you can find more information here.

Getting around the city



By foot

Amsterdam's inner city is quite picturesque and definitely walkable, there are no great distances to be covered. Just be careful not to step on the bikelanes.

By bicycle

On a bike you can get pretty much everywhere around Amsterdam, there are numerous places to rent a bike for a whole day or more, just do some research before and you won't be disappointed by
