



## GETTING IN SEVILLE

---

### By car

There are several highways and ring road connecting Seville to all the main cities of Spain. Please check [this website](#) for information on all the available options.

### By train

Seville is well connected with all major cities in Spain and with several smaller cities around the region. Many lines pass through “Santa Justa Station” the city’s central station, notably from:

- **Cordoba:** around 40 minutes;
- **Madrid:** two hours and a half ride;
- **Valencia:** four hours ride;
- **Barcelona:** five hours and a half ride.



From Santa Justa Station to the city center:

- **by taxi:** taxi waiting area in front of the station or call +34 954 58 00 00;
- **by bus:** there are several bus lines stopping near the station. Please check the official [webpage](#) for information on the buses and fees;
- **by metro:** there are several metro lines stopping at the station. You can use the same website as the buses to check all public transportation in Seville;

### By plane

Airport Diego Velázquez is the only airport of Seville. From this airport you can reach the centre in the following ways:

- **by taxi** (from 20 minutes): taxi waiting area in front of the airport or call 658 904 289 or 954 580 000.

### On foot
