



## GETTING IN NICE

---

### By car

Nice is a major city in France and can be reached easily from all over the country. Furthermore, thanks to its location it can be reached quite easily from Italy and Switzerland. Please check [this website](#) for information on arriving in the city, parking, and restrictions to the traffic.

### By train

Nice is France's fifth biggest city and is well connected with Paris and some other major cities in the country and even other European countries (mainly with Italy). Many lines converge into the city's central station called "Nice-Ville", notably from:

- **Paris:** 5 hours and 50 minutes ride;
- **Marseille:** 2 hours and 30 minutes ride;
- **Ventimiglia:** 50 minutes ride.



From Nice-Ville Railway Station, you can reach the city center by foot (in around 30 minutes) or by public transportation like the metro and buses (in around 15 minutes). More information on public transportation can be found [here](#).

### By plane

**Nice Côte d'Azur**, is the only airport in the city. From this airport you can reach the center in the following ways:

- **by taxi:** taxi waiting area in front of the airport or call +33 (0)4 93 13 78 78.
- **by train:** the airport is connected to the city center via train. More information is available on the official [website](#).
- **By tram/bus:** there are several tram and bus lines connecting the airport to different parts of the city. You can check all the available connections on the [official website](#).

Another airport near Nice is the “Cannes Mandelieu” Airport in Cannes. The airport is around an hour from Nice and can be reached by bus. More information is available on the official [website](#).

## Getting around the city

---

### On foot



Nice is not an extremely big city but it can be quite tiring to reach all the monuments on foot (some of them are on top of a hill). However, on foot is the best way to enjoy and admire the city and discover its neighborhoods!

### By bus or tram

Nice is well connected with more than 100 bus lines and 3 tram lines.

### By bike

Nice is a very bike-friendly city with lots of kilometers of cycle paths. Nice is crisscrossed with yellow bike lanes, the most beautiful of which is the seaside bike path that traces the entire length of the Promenade des Anglais.
